of the allegations in the ninth and tenth sentences of this paragraph, and therefore deny them. Answering the eleventh sentence, Defendants deny that the use of Granite's five-acre parcel in question is illegal; affirmatively allege that Granite acquired and owned its parcel before Plaintiffs acquired or moved onto theirs, and therefore Plaintiffs made their decision to buy their parcel and move onto it fully knowing Granite's use of its property; and lack sufficient information to form a belief as to the truth or falsity of the remaining allegations in this sentence and therefore deny them. Defendants lack sufficient information to form a belief as to the truth or falsity of the allegations in the twelfth sentence of this paragraph, and therefore deny them. Answering the thirteenth sentence of this paragraph, Defendants deny that only one cell tower exists and lack sufficient information to form a belief as to the truth or falsity of the remaining allegations in this sentence and therefore deny them.

- 3. Answering Paragraph 3, Defendants admit the allegations in the first sentence of this paragraph. Answering the second sentence of this paragraph, Defendants lack sufficient information to form a belief as to the truth or falsity of the allegations regarding Plaintiff Micuda's beliefs and impressions and therefore deny them. Further answering the second sentence of this paragraph, Defendants deny that Damon Bruns is a Captain with the Phoenix Fire Department, and affirmatively allege that Damon Bruns is employed as an Engineer with the Phoenix Fire Department. Defendants deny the allegations in the third, fourth, fifth, and sixth sentences in this paragraph, which should be stricken under Rule 12(f), Ariz.R.Civ.P., for making "immaterial, impertinent, or scandalous" allegations.
- 4. Answering Paragraph 4, Defendants admit the allegations in the first and third sentences. Defendants deny the allegations in the second sentence of this paragraph.
- 5. Answering Paragraph 5, Defendants lack sufficient information to form a belief as to the truth or falsity of the allegations in the first and third sentences of this
